Best of Illinois Honoring the Chicago Cubs and the Ricketts Family

On May 19, 2011, the Illinois Chapter held the annual Best of Illinois event raising more than \$700,000 for diabetes research. This inspiring event was held at Wrigley Field, honoring the Chicago Cubs and the Ricketts family and included a special tribute to Ron Santo.



The double-header occasion began with a Little Sluggers family event, in which kids and their parents experienced guided tours of Wrigley

Field. Kicked off by Dave Kaplan from WGN Radio, JDRF Illinois Executive Director Patrick Reedy, and honoree Tom Ricketts, families enjoyed all that Wrigley had to offer while supporting JDRF's mission.



The evening portion of the event allowed guests to explore "The Friendly Confines," including walking on the field, touring the clubhouses, dugouts, media booth, and batting cages. Guests enjoyed dinner before emcee David Eanet from WGN Radio, welcomed guests in the stadium seats. The night quickly got exciting with John Vincent singing the "Star-Spangled Banner," a thrilling live auction, and Billy Corgan, front man for the Smashing Pumpkins, singing "Take Me Out to the Ballgame" along with a group of kids.

The Fund A Cure program featured moving speeches from Kady Helme and Glen Tullman, who acknowledged Ron Santo's eternal optimism, which inspired so many to work harder and give more in the search for a cure. As a tribute to Ron, flowers were placed on third base by ten JDRF Illinois volunteers, who then embraced Ron Santo, Jr. A moment of silence was held in honor of Ron. His daughter, Linda Santo Brown, spoke about the family's commitment to carrying on Ron's legacy and their determination to honor his dream of a cure for type 1 diabetes.

The Fund A Cure program raised nearly \$365,000, which will benefit research in the area of complications. At the request of the Chicago Cubs and the Ricketts family, the funds will be named in honor of Ron Santo.

Best of Illinois event chair John McDonough presented Tom Ricketts with the Jim Tyree Award, which was recently renamed in memory of Jim Tyree, an outstanding champion for the city of Chicago and the JDRF community.

JDRF Today: JDRF is Evolving

For more than 40 years, JDRF has been a leader in the search for an end to type 1 diabetes, through both research funding and advocacy. During that time, we have always talked about a cure as a singular destination: a return to normal physiology.

But today, we realize that a cure is not just a destination but also a journey along a path. And we recognize that a part of our mission must be to keep those living with type 1 diabetes today healthy until we arrive at the end of that path.

In addition, we understand that the word "juvenile" is no longer descriptive of the disease or those burdened with it. JDRF market research tells us that, today, 85 percent of those in the U.S. living with type 1 diabetes are adults. JDRF is an organization for ALL ages, and ALL stages of this disease.

The new JDRF identity was created with these key considerations in mind. We have dropped the formal name "Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation" from our identity and will be known simply as JDRF. This better reflects our commitment to work for ALL those with type 1 diabetes.

An essential graphic element

in the logo design is the unique and clever inclusion of the "T1D" symbol. Intentionally subordinate to the JDRF name, the symbol reinforces our focus on type 1 diabetes, and moves us toward establishing T1D as identifiable shorthand.



Another unique and recognizable element is the "momentum lines" that frame the JDRF name on top and bottom. This element adds more energy and motion to the overall look and feel of the identity. Most important, it is reflective of both the progress we've made and the accelerated progress we aim for.

The logo works in conjunction with the brand tagline to create an impactful and memorable identity. JDRF is evolving and a new logo is just the beginning. Join us as we continue our outstanding work: Improving lives. Curing type 1 diabetes.



Dear Friends,

Serving as Board President of the Illinois Chapter has been a privilege and a remarkable lesson in the focus and determination of JDRF and its supporters. I wish I didn't have to serve

JDRF has taken a proactive step in assuring that the FDA hears from you by starting this petition. By letting them know that families living with type 1 diabetes are watching, waiting, and urging the FDA to not stand in the way of bringing this life saving technology to market, JDRF is giving so many of us a voice. Due to your financial support other exciting milestones are taking place, such as advances in the discovery and development of glucose-responsive insulin, regeneration to preserve and restore functional beta cells, and advances in the development of the artificial pancreas. It is going to take all of us to come together whether through our advocacy efforts, wallets, or sharing JDRF's mission to truly make a difference. If we are looking to JDRF for results, as supporters we should look to each other to do the same.

Our voices and our dollars count now more than ever. I look forward to seeing the results of our collective efforts, as I know they will be extraordinary.

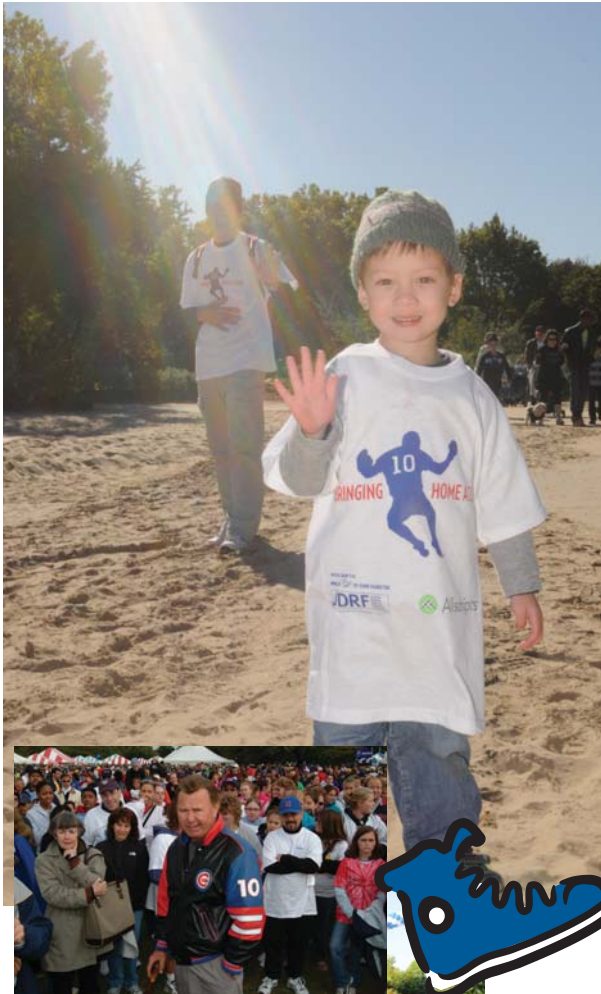

The 33rd Annual Ron Santo Walk to Cure Diabetes was held at six locations across Illinois on a beautiful Sunday, October 2nd drawing 30,000 participants in Chicago, Libertyville, Lisle, Schaumburg, Palos Hills, and Peoria. The collective goal for these walks is to raise \$5 million for diabetes research.

There was a noticeable absence this year without the Chapter's friend and the Walk's namesake, Ron Santo. Walk day was one of Ron's favorite days of the year and he was thrilled by the more than \$60 million raised through this Walk in his name. 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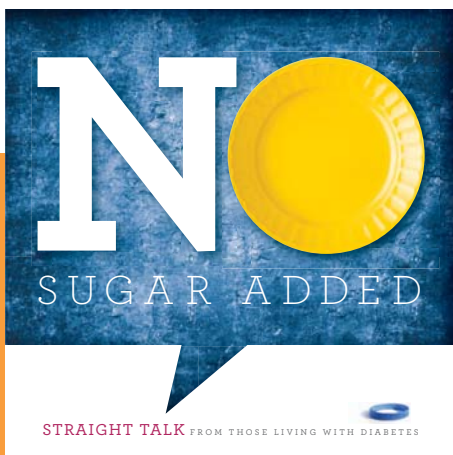

It's easy to get so focused on these critical activities that we may miss the importance of countless other efforts going on year-round to help us reach this singular goal.

2011 CHILDREN'S CONGRESS: RECAP

Picture this: a panel of United States Senators listening intently to compelling testimonies about the burden of living with type 1 diabetes from distinguished witnesses framed by a vivid sea of blue t-shirts worn by the 155 delegates of the JDRF 2011 Children's Congress.

This Senate hearing on June 22, 2011 was the culminating event of the biennial JDRF Children's Congress, one of the most powerful advocacy events in Washington, D.C. It capped off almost three days of incredible activities—comprising the largest media and grassroots advocacy event held in support of finding better treatments and a cure for type 1 diabetes.

The “faces” of this urgent need are the delegates, ages 4 to 17, from all 50 states and seven foreign countries. The Senate hearing is the final touch point between the delegates, research and regulatory experts, and Congressional lawmakers—it is designed to create synergy to advance the science further and faster.

2011 RIDE TO CURE DIABETES:



The 2011 Ride to Cure Diabetes has been our biggest year yet! Team Illinois was represented at all five courses and included more than 30 determined riders. Have you considered participating in the Ride? Read one rider's story to learn about this inspirational experience and how you can make a difference.

Rider's Story: Mary Gollings

What is your relationship to JDRF and type 1 diabetes?

I have had type 1 for 24 years. My family and I turned to JDRF for support when I was first diagnosed. I have volunteered for many walks and the gala over the years. I joined the Ride to Cure program in 2010 and I will be participating in my third ride in November.

How did you get involved with the Ride?

I was turning thirty that summer and wanted to make a commitment to something that I felt would allow me to give back to JDRF, as well as reach a personal goal. I had bought a new bike earlier that year and was riding about ten miles each day. I decided to reach for the stars and start training. My family and friends supported me and cheered me on all year while I trained. From the moment I arrived at my first ride weekend, I was hooked.

Can you describe participating in the ride for the first time?

When I caught a glimpse of the hills and climbs ahead of me at my first ride weekend, I wasn't quite sure what I had gotten myself into. The people I met throughout ride weekend showed me I could accomplish more than I ever imagined, though. They

stayed with me up every last hill. They gave me hope and they reminded me that I am never alone in this battle. I crossed a finish line for the first time in my life- completing 60 miles in the hills of Vermont.

What keeps you motivated?

My family and friends' support of my ride, and JDRF's research efforts, are steadfast and encourage me to keep training all year. The camaraderie I share with my teammates is inspiring and unbreakable. We are committed to helping find a cure and to supporting each other in our battles with this terrible disease.

With every person I meet at ride weekend, I carry another reason why I fight so hard for this cure. And each of these reasons are what helped me cross the finish line this year when I completed my first century ride.

Why will you continue to ride?

Being a part of the Ride to Cure program is so much bigger than one weekend. It turned the daily task of fighting a chronic disease into a life mission of curing it. I will continue to ride every year to raise awareness about Type 1 diabetes and to support our research efforts until we find that cure.

JDRF LAUNCHES NEW ADULT TYPE 1 TOOLKIT

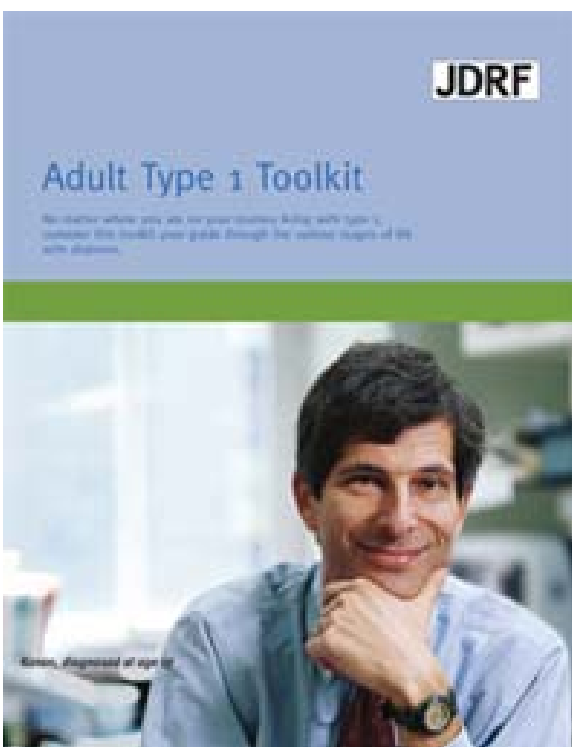
JDRF has created a new toolkit for adults as part of its efforts to reach all people living with type 1 diabetes. Building on the organization's popular toolkit for newly diagnosed adults, the new Adult Type 1 Toolkit focuses on issues faced by adults who have been living with the disease for a longer period of time.

Written by adults with type 1 diabetes, the Adult Type 1 Toolkit is a comprehensive guidebook that addresses challenges that arise beyond the initial period of diagnosis. The toolkit provides support for a number of significant life circumstances that impact adults who are living with type 1 diabetes. These topics include workplace concerns, insurance questions, blood glucose management issues, and considerations about planning a family, among others.

The resources provided in this toolkit illustrate JDRF's support of the type 1 diabetes community—and the organization's unwavering commitment to the 85 percent of individuals with type 1 who are age 18 or older. The Adult Type 1 Toolkit is designed to be a resource to address many of the issues that adults living with type 1 might encounter in their lives. However, because many issues are personal and require individual assistance, the toolkit also provides other sources of information, including how to locate diabetes healthcare professionals, support groups, and online resources. Readers can also find information about local JDRF chapters in the toolkit.

Looking to the future, JDRF plans to create additional toolkits that focus on specific life stages. "JDRF is proud to launch its newest toolkit to expand our efforts to reach adults living with type 1 diabetes," says Andrea Hulke, director of national outreach for JDRF. "This disease knows no age and we are looking forward to creating more resources to support the needs of people with type 1 at any time in their lives."

CHICAGO AUTO SHOW'S FIRST LOOK FOR CHARITY



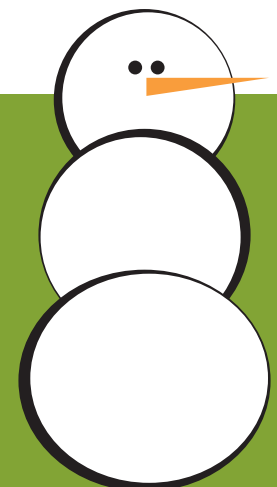
